This workshop will provide an opportunity for junior faculty to become acquainted with the NSF Faculty Early Career Development Program (CAREER). The CAREER Program offers the National Science Foundation's most prestigious awards in support of junior faculty who exemplify the role of teacher-scholars through outstanding research, excellent education and the integration of education and research within the context of the mission of their organizations. Dr. Eric Chitambar, a current CAREER recipient, will provide insight on how to craft a proposal and address frequently asked questions.

Eligibility:

- Hold a Doctoral Degree
- Be untenured and be employed in a tenure track position as an assistant professor by October 1st following the deadline for submission of CAREER proposals
- Have not submitted more than twice previously and have not previously received an NSF PECASE or CAREER award; can be an NSF recipient in other programs
- Work in a discipline normally funded by NSF
